Phased return to school for Year 6 Children

Dear Parents

As you know Year 6 is one of the prioritised year groups that the government have identified that are able to return to school. We are constantly reviewing our risk assessment alongside the latest updates from the government and after staff training that will take place on Monday and Tuesday we are satisfied that we are able to welcome back children in **Year 6 on Wednesday 10th June.**

As a parent of a child in Year 6 this information is specifically for you and not all year groups:

When does my child start?

Children in Year 6 will be able to start school on Wednesday 10th June

Will my child be in their class?

To ensure we are able to keep groups of children in small groups to reduce the risk of transmission the children will be in smaller groups (maximum 15 children) called 'bubbles' (please read the Welcome Back booklet attached to this email).

With the number of Year 6 children who have indicated they will be returning low we will initially have one bubble for Year 6 children with Miss Kasomo in Templar classroom with Miss Rippon supporting.

If numbers increase we will create another Year 6 bubble with Miss Rippon to ensure the group is kept small and they will use the hall for their bubble space, we will create this new bubble based on numbers of children and friendships.

What are the staggered start and finish times for the day?

As per government guidance adults are required to stay 2m apart at all times. We will have staggered start and finish times and strict drop off zones so that we don't have overcrowding of parents at these times and you are able to wait safely, 2m spaces shown by the cones outside.

Year 6 children will be able to enter the school building between **8.45 - 9.00 and will finish at 3.15.** It is crucial that Year 6 stick to these times as Key Worker children will also be accessing school but will have different times. **Please do not come to school early and wait** - you must only be at school at your allocated times of 8.45 - 9.00 and 3.15 and must wait 2m apart to collect your child.

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Year 6 children will enter and exit the school at our **usual front gate** and will use the entrance door next to the school office (they will go straight into their classroom and not go through another bubble's space).

Parents will be unable to enter the school building and you will need to say goodbye at the gate and keep 2m distance from staff. Miss Kasomo and Miss Ripppn will be in the hall and classroom to help your child safely to the classroom and know where to put their things.

To ensure the Year 6 and Key worker bubbles do not mix we have a queuing system indicated outside of the building where it is safe to wait.

This is illustrated in the video that will be sent to parents.

What are expectations of attendance?

The government is expecting all children who attend to do so full time and we are unable to offer part time attendance. It is ultimately parents' decision if their child attends and parents will not be fined for non-attendance, but we are required to take a register and check on any children who have not attended.

Are children expected to socially distance in school?

No. Once in pods, 2m social distancing is not required but they should try to stay as far apart as possible. Children in Y1, Y6 or key worker children will be sat at desks which are spaced out with individual equipment.

What does my child need to bring to school?

The only permitted items will be packed lunch boxes and a water bottle. Please leave all school bags, toys and equipment at home.

Does my child need to wear school uniform?

The government has asked that parents apply usual rules to clothing and we would ask that they come to school in clean clothes every day. We would like to encourage the wearing of school uniform as we feel children will be helped with the routine and familiarity of wearing it and it is easier for parents; however we fully understand that children may have grown out of their uniform or may not have enough items of school uniform if it is unclean. So we will have a relaxation of the uniform rules and would encourage it if possible but understand if there are some days when something different is worn.

As it is warmer, summer uniform of dresses, shorts, trousers and white top will be comfortable for the children to wear.

What happens at lunchtime?

To minimise risk we will provide all children eligible for free school meals with a packed lunch (we will not be having any hot food served at this time). All free school meal children will be provided with a packed lunch in school (this will replace the FSM vouchers you have been receiving from



Edenred). Children will be asked for their sandwich preference at the start of the day - all other children to bring a packed lunch from home. Please also send in a named water bottle.

The children will eat in their bubble in their classroom. At lunch and play time, the children will have designated time to play in the playground with their bubble.

Will they be continuing the same lessons as before lockdown?

We will introduce a soft timetable to help the children to regain a sense of school structure. There will be a mix of a restorative curriculum balanced with other traditional learning experiences. We will continue to provide the home learning provision for those not in school.

Will staff wear PPE? Will the children be wearing masks?

Staff in schools are not required to use PPE and children are not required to wear masks. However, some staff may choose to do so. Where a child needs first aid or shows symptoms of Covid-19 they will be attended to by a member of staff wearing PPE. A member of the team may take a child's temperature, if they are concerned about their health.

I realise that there is a lot of information here so we are making a short child friendly video that will help not just children but parents too visualise what it will look like and where you will need to be.
