


Head of Academy Update Spring Term 2

Bradley Botanists!

This term we have all become a specific type of Scientist, Botanists! This means that we have been studying plants and developing experiments to test what we know about them. We set up one experiment to investigate if we could change the colour of Daffodils! We love the usual yellow colour, but we thought that they might only stay that colour because the water that we water them with is clear. We set up three jugs. One just had blue food colouring in it, another had green food colouring and the final one just had water in it. This meant that it could be a fair test. Over the week we watched the daffodils bloom and expected them to take up some of the colour... however, our predictions did not work and they remained a very pale yellow! We will try again with a different species of daffodil.




Templar Class

Remote Learning Questionnaire

Thank you for your responses to the remote learning questionnaire.

• 90% of you considered that your child was coping well with the current situation.



"It is a tricky balance but I have loved being involved in my children's subjects and am so proud of their efforts"

• 55 % of you completed between 1 and 4 hours per day of remote learning.

"I love being part of their learning and whilst a juggle on top of a toddler and working from home we are finding a routine."

• 70% of children coped well or very well at home with the home learning.

"They do miss their friends but I think the fact that you hold virtual meet ups is a great idea."

• 95% of you considered the communication from the school being clear or very clear.

"Excellent communication and remote learning, good variety of activities. If ever we need help and support we get a very quick helpful response".

• 85% of you considered it was easy or very easy to discuss your childs learning progress with the school.

"Thank you for being available to discuss my child's learning when needed".

• 95% of you felt somewhat or very much part of the school community during lockdown .

"The assemblies are lovely to keep us feeling a community as are the class check ins. Coffee mornings are a great idea. The communication has been just lovely - supportive and understanding of home life and the emphasis on the children being safe and happy is exactly right."

Thank you to all of our inspiring artists.






SCHOOL UNIFORM
