



## 1. My child is happy at a Trust school




## 2. There is a positive benefit on my child's education by being part of a Multi-Academy Trust




We recognise that we need to improve how we share with parents the benefits that your child experiences as a result of being part of a large family of schools.

This question is only applicable to Church schools in our family.


## 4. I receive helpful information about how being part of a Trust benefits my child's educational journey



This relates to question 2 and we are currently reviewing how we provide helpful and meaningful information to parents about how being part of a family of schools provides a better quality educational offer.




## 5. My child feels safe at a Trust School




This represents the robust behaviour, safety and safeguarding approaches that we have across our family of schools.



## 6. The Trust schools makes sure its pupils are well behaved




## 7. My child has been bullied and the Trust schools dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively



Whilst we are thrilled that 79% of families have not experienced bullying of their child, we are focused on the 7% who have experienced bullying. We have revised our Anti-Bullying Policy and implemented a Relationships and Health Education curriculum which addresses emotions, behaviours and staying safe.


## 8. The Trust schools make me aware of what my child will learn during the year




Our schools do produce curriculum booklets, share learning in newsletters and use social media but this is not supporting all of our parents. We have started to change our newsletter formats to help the information easier to access. 
9. When I have raised concerns with the Trust schools they have been dealt with properly



10. Does your child have special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)?




11. If yes, how strongly do you agree with this statement? "My child has SEND and the Trust schools give them the support they need to succeed."






**12. The Trust schools have high expectations for my child**




**14. The Trust schools let me know how my child is doing**



**15. There is a good range of subjects available to my child at the Trust schools**




**13. My child does well at a Trust school**




