- They would like more sport and music opportunities and 94% felt that they can learn about lots of different subjects.
- 91% of children know how to stay safe online and 95% feel confident that someone would help them if they were worried.
- A popular request was to have more opportunities to meet and learn with their sister schools watch this space!
- 97% of our children are proud of their school.

We will be working to bring the children together for meaningful events. They gave us so many suggestions we have a lot to keep us all busy with.

Covid restrictions will look very different in September for you and your child, and each school will share their risk assessments and new routines. We will no longer be working in bubbles, and you will no longer be told when to isolate by the school but by NHS Test and Trace. Please do take a moment to read the information that your child's school provides so that your child feels prepared for September. This will be with you before the end of term.
