Being part of a schools Trust, the Learning Academy Partnership, means your child benefits from the expertise and support of many, not just the team here at ASM and the past few weeks, staff have been working together on a number of exciting developments. Miss Burton has been working with teachers at Dunsford to develop how we teach reasoning in maths, Mrs Rippon and Mrs Armstrong have been working with our Trust Phonics and Reading specialist to look at developing a love of reading.

We have also had visitors into our school this week. Mrs Bone, Director of Education for the Trust came in to talk about development of teaching and learning across the school and Miss Watson came into look at how we teach while class reading. Teachers have also benefitted from the expertise of our Trust Maths Lead Mrs Palmer.

Our school library is looking a little tired and untidy after two years of being blocked off due to COVID restrictions. Now that we are able to use the space again we want to make it an inviting and warm area that children can relax and enjoy a book in.
