



We will continue to issue 'Warn and Inform' letters if there is a case in your child's class or close contact group so that we can all continue to take as many precautions as possible. Thank you for understanding and support because it is helping keep our school communities safe.

As a School Trust have been looking at the impact of the lockdowns on the children. Where we have seen the greatest impact is on our younger children who have been in school the least amount of time due to their age. We will be ensuring that all our younger pupils are successful readers as soon as possible. Why? Because this unlocks the other curriculum areas. We have invested in additional resources to support the teaching of Phonics by working together as a School Trust.

We have invested in additional training for your child's teacher, more books, and resources. It also means if we were ever asked to move to home learning, there are clear and easy to use resources for you to be able to support your child if they are a younger reader.

However, it has been wonderful to see lots of things go back to normal. As a Trust we work with The Spires College, Torquay, who provide us with our sports support. They provide a specialist teacher in your child's school each week and the opportunity to be part of competitions and festivals. It has been so wonderful to provide your child with the full programme of sport activities, including restarting our after-school clubs. We want to inspire our future British Olympians and it is brilliant to see the children enjoying the opportunities that we provide.

We are slowly building up to whole school events, taking local cases into consideration. We really hope to be able to invite you in over this next half term, dependent on cases, so thank you for bearing with us.
