Welcome back to the first half of the Spring term! Happy New Year and I hope that you all had a marvellous Christmas break. This term is full of some exciting topics in our different curriculum areas.

In PE, we will be starting Dance, where we will look at creating sequences that link to the beat of the music. We will also be focusing on flow and how we can move to the rhythm of the music in order to create certain moods and feelings. To link to our music learning, we will also be thinking about the tempo of the song and the instruments used in the background to made a song worth listening to.





This term, our class book is *Street Child* by Berlie Doherty. It focuses on a child living in the Victorian era. We cannot wait to dive in and find out more information. Maths will have a focus on multiplication and division, where the children will be learning to divide using thousands. Please ensure that the children are still practising their times tables at home (on TT Rickstars) in order to ensure that they are quicker at problem solving. Homework will remain on line and if you have any questions about how to access it, please let us know.



In English, we will be writing to inform and the children will be learning how to use formal language. As the children read more, their vocabulary will increase, which will help them to become fluent writers. Science will focus on *Living things* while History will be on *The Victorians*. We look forward to exploring new learning and ideas!
