Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the second half of the Spring Term. I hope that you all had a wonderful break and are ready for another great term. This week in Templar Class, we started some new topics in various subjects and cannot wait to explore more of them. In Geography, we will be focusing on *Rivers* and our aim is to see how rivers link to the local economy. We will also look at the uses of rivers and how they differ from a local to global scale.

In Maths, we will be moving on to Fractions, where the children will use their knowledge of the four operations, especially multiplication and addition. English will focus on non fiction writing in the form of instruction writing and informative writing. Our new book is called *Kensuke's Kingdom* and we will use it to explore language and texts deeply as we learn more about reading and inferring. We will continue with our 'word of the day' activity; the children are showing great progress in the vocabulary that they are choosing to use in their writing across the curriculum.

Art will focus on Cubism and the artist we will be studying is Paul Klee. The children will use shape, lines, colour and space to create their own cubism-inspired art outcomes. We will be using coloured pencils, pastels and some paper to create collages. RHE (Relationships and Health Education) will involve exploring living in the world today and the children will discuss rules, laws, responsibilities and making choices.
