explored plants and mammals. We dissected some plants and looked carefully at real life lilies and how each sections plays a part in plant reproduction. This week, we classified some animals and put them in categories of our choice. We also looked at different ways that Scienctist categorise living things and we will be having a go at creating classification charts like real life scientists.
