A new feature of our weekly newsletters will be the inclusion of your child's class attendance for the previous week. Attendance is vital for the children to make good academic and personal progress. We understand that some absences are unavoidable, please speak to us if you have any concerns or questions. If your child is unwell, please call the office before 9.00am to let us know.
95% = 47 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 8 days in total or 1 week and 3 days

85% = 142 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 24 days in total or 4 weeks and 4 days
