Since the School Trust began 10 years ago, we have grown to 11 schools which not only provides financial efficiencies but also increased expertise and resources which can be used to benefit your child. We are excited to share that some schools in Cornwall would like their children to benefit from what we can achieve as a single organisation (School Trust).

A hub of Cornwall schools will be joining over the coming months starting with St Mark's C of E Primary School, who will be joining us under a Management Partnership whilst they complete the consultation and due diligence process. We have also had approval from the Department for Education for Jacobstow Community Primary School to join our family. We are also awaiting approval for Marhamchurch C of E Academy to move from Celtic Cross Education into our Trust family which has been a joint decision between Celtic Cross and the Department for Education.

This will have no impact on your child's education other than a positive one. As we grow, we grow in expertise and experience that we can offer your child through the educational offer.

We have loved the opening up of schools and welcoming you back in. Our Jubilee events have been great fun and the children have loved every moment. Looking ahead, we are so excited to see the return of productions, events, and celebrations. Please check your child's school dates for events happening in their academy.

Dear Parents, Carers and Families,

Welcome to the School Trust June newsletter. This is a short half term, but we have already managed to fit quite a lot in. Being part of a School Trust is how your child's school can ensure an excellent curriculum offer and one where your child can flourish. This happens through sharing excellent practice and having a shared responsibility for the 2000 children in our family. I wanted to share what is happening across our family.

Each school has now completed their Pupil Questionnaire and your child's Head Teacher will share these with you. Because we are a larger family, we also amalgamated the results to give a picture for the entire School Trust. **94% of children are proud to attend their school; 93% of children feel that their teacher knows how they learn; 91% of children know how to keep themselves safe online.** They also challenged us to improve some things. The children would like to see increased opportunities for sports and music.

Last year the children told us that they wanted to get to know children in the other schools in our School Trust. We have worked on this, and now they have identified more precise joint activities and opportunities that they would like us to create. We highly value stakeholder feedback so we will take up the challenge to improve these opportunities for your child.
