FAMILY SUPPORT

Christmas Toy Appeal

As in previous years, the Salvation Army have kindly offered to help families in need this Christmas.

They will be concentrating on Toys and aim to provide 3 items for each child plus a selection pack and copy of their Children's Christmas comic. They try and tailor the presents, so it would be helpful to know about the children's special interests or disabilities/allergies if they have any, dinosaurs, cars etc. or requires toys with no sound effects/tactile etc. They also need to know the age and gender of the children.

If you would like Mrs Webber to make a referral, please let her know her by 1st December. They will also need your name and family postcode which will be treated in the strictest of confidence and for that reason we do ask for your permission to share this information.

Household Support Fund

I am pleased to announce that we have access to further funding to support families on low incomes to support with food and utility costs. This is through the Household Support Fund, which Early Help are administering locally. The scheme runs from October 2023 to end of March 2024. Funds are limited, so when the allocation is used up, the fund will close. Through this fund, Early Help is able to provide a grant per family to support with:

- Food
- Supporting for energy and water bills for household purposes
- Essential white goods such as a fridge, freezer, or cooker
- Consideration for petrol for essential journeys

This Fund is NOT able to provide funds for the following, which is NOT an exhaustive list:

- Washing machines
- Driers
- Beds / Furniture
- School Uniform

You will need to meet the following criteria: - You are a family (at least 2 people where at least 1 person is either pre-birth or up to 18 years old) – You are experiencing financial hardship – You need financial help to pay utility bills or buy food and essential items linked to food, warmth, and utilities for your family – Not have received financial assistance from another source for the same reason
