
All Saints Marsh Academy – from Reception up to Year 6 – launched its new Handwriting scheme this week. We are following a Learning Academy Partnership policy, with resources taken from Read Write Inc which is very well established in the school so most children are already familiar with the language and signals. For Templar class – the oldest children in the school – I understand that there can be some resistance to changing a handwriting style after so long in Primary school. However, it is essential that every Primary school child can form letters correctly: this means that each letter should be a consistent size, relative to the other letters, and actually be produced correctly so that handwriting is a smooth and straightforward process for the children. If a letter is being formed incorrectly – for example, if a child is writing an 'Q', by starting at the bottom, then this significantly

editing his own work!

slows down their writing speed. It also takes more effort to form letters incorrectly than correctly so all the teachers and support staff have joined together to work really hard this academic year on making handwriting easier and smoother for the children.

In Templar, our particular focus this week has been on sitting correctly when you write (this is called 'Posture') and holding the pencil in the grip that will allow the most movement and support for the pencil. This is called a tripod grip. Please see the images below and practice this with your child at home. Practice makes perfect!

- · feet flat on the floor
- . bottom at the back of the chair
- body one fist from the table
- · shoulders down and relaxed
- · back leaning forward slightly
- left/right hand holding the page
- · left/right hand ready in a tripod grip.



In English this week, Templar class have finished the teaching part of this unit: they have learned skills to support them with Writing to Entertain to create their own Fantasy story based on an animal that can talk and wears human clothes. The children are supported through learning chunks, 3 per lesson, where each skill is modelled using the children's ideas so that the children have a clear example to follow to then create their own. They also have a display that covers every skill in the unit, with an example: this means that Templar class currently have a whole Fantasy story on their English display! The children are not allowed to copy this example but it is there to help them with reminders of the skills.

We say farewell to Mr Bird this week and wish him well for his future adventures.

'Working with Templar class for the last 10 weeks has been incredible; the children and school have been really welcoming. I feel really privileged to be a part of their school journey even if it was for a short amount of time.
