Star of the Week:

Dear Parents and carers,

All Saints Marsh Academy – from Reception up to Year 6 – launched its new Handwriting scheme this week. We are following a Learning Academy Partnership policy, with resources taken from Read Write Inc which is very well established in the school so most children are already familiar with the language and signals. It is essential that every Primary school child can form letters correctly: this means that each letter should be a consistent size, relative to the other letters, and actually be produced correctly so that handwriting is a smooth and straightforward process for the children. If a letter is being formed incorrectly – for example, if a child

is writing an '**Q**', by starting at the bottom, then this significantly slows down their writing speed. It also takes more effort to form letters incorrectly than correctly so all the teachers and support staff have joined


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Irina – for showing excellent learning behaviour and persevering with her writing

together to work really hard this academic year on making handwriting easier and smoother for the children.

In Forde, our particular focus this week has been on sitting correctly when you write (this is called 'Posture') and holding the pencil in the grip that will allow the most movement and support for the pencil. This is called a tripod grip. Please see the images below and practice this with your child at home. Practice makes perfect!

- · feet flat on the floor
- bottom at the back of the chair
- body one fist from the table
- shoulders down and relaxed
- · back leaning forward slightly
- · left/right hand holding the page
- left/right hand ready in a tripod grip.



This week in Forde Class we have also been continuing to practise our nativity. The children are working on their lines and remembering where to stand! They are doing very well but please practise lines at home so that we can go script-free from next week! Please could any costume bits be brought in by Monday 4th December, in a named bag. Let us know if you have any questions or need any assistance in getting costumes.

In Maths this week we have begun our learning on Shape. The children have been learning names of 2D and 3D shapes. I wonder if you can spot any shapes over the weekend while you're out and about! We have been exploring corners, edges and faces. How many faces does a sphere have?

Reception children have been enjoying learning about celebrations in Continuous Provision and making birthday cards and paper chains. They have also been looking at dental hygiene and how to clean our teeth effectively.



FAMILY SUPPORT
