Getting Started

1. Choose an arts activity to do at home.

The <u>Creative Challenges</u> have been provided by local artists using materials that you should be able to find at home.

2. Complete the Arts Award Log Book.

Complete a <u>simple form</u> to show what you have learned about art through doing your Creative Challenge.

3. Record what you have been doing.

You can use whatever materials you like to record your activities; writing, drawing, painting, taking photos - just get creative and take photos of what you make for your certification.

4. Send off for your certificate

When you have completed all 3 parts of Discover at Home and gathered together your evidence e.g. photos and log book, you are ready to claim your official Arts Award Discover certificate from Trinity College London. You will need an adult to help you with this stage and to make the payment of £6.00 to cover the cost of your official certificate and postage/packing*
