This week children in Forde class have been enjoying stories and Continuous Provision based around our theme of Space. Next week we will be building rockets for our class alien – if you are able to keep hold of any bits of cardboard from your recycling we would be grateful for it to help us make them!

In Science this week the children experimented with different materials; they found out which materials were bendy, waterproof, smooth and seethrough. They then recorded their findings in the Science books.

We continued our learning on the Great Fire of London and found out how the fire spread so quickly. We read an extract of Samuel Pepys's diary

and found out what the people were doing as the fire spread quickly from house to house.

In Maths this week Year 2 children have continued their learning on Time. They have discovered how to tell time to and past the hour. The Reception children have enjoyed counting to 10 and saying one more than and one less than a given number.

Next week we will have a student teacher joining us. She will be here two days a week for the rest of the half term. I am sure the children will enjoy having somebody new in the class and will give her a warm welcome.
