Dear Parents and Carers,

In English this week, Templar class have completed their own newspaper report about the Big Bad Pig and the three little wolves. One of the sections of the newspaper explored why the Pig felt compelled to cause such damage to the homes of the three little wolves and we had some very funny, creative ideas! For example, throughout the story, the wolves cherish a china teapot: one child suggested that the Pig is destroying their homes because he wanted to buy the china teapot, but the wolves pushed in front of him in the queue! Another suggestion was that there was a history of family conflict between the pigs and the wolves – a bit like an animal version of Romeo and Juliet!

Year 5 and Year 6 are studying 'The House of Wisdom' in History this Half

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Term as a way of answering their Key Question: Why should we remember Baghdad 900AD? Looking to other cultures and countries as a way of explaining our own past and current life experience is really eye-opening for the children. We have learned that The House of Wisdom was created as a private library in 786AD in Baghdad, Iraq. In 830AD, it became a public centre for learning: it's aim was to seek knowledge by inviting scholars all of faiths, men and women, to debate learning and to translate important scholarly texts. This determination to develop learning, instead of just accepting what you knew, was really unusual for the time: debate, challenge and change is standard in universities today and the House of Wisdom is partly where such an approach came from.


Ready Player Read is Newton Abbot Library's brand new reading challenge for adults!

That's not all! Read just 10 prompts before the


