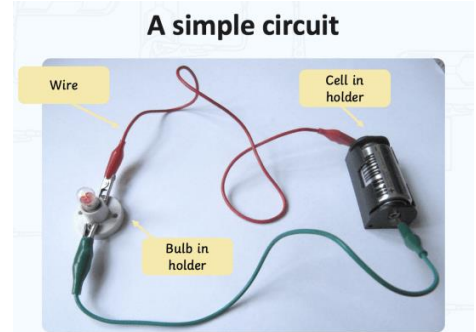
You are always coming into school ready to learn and engage.

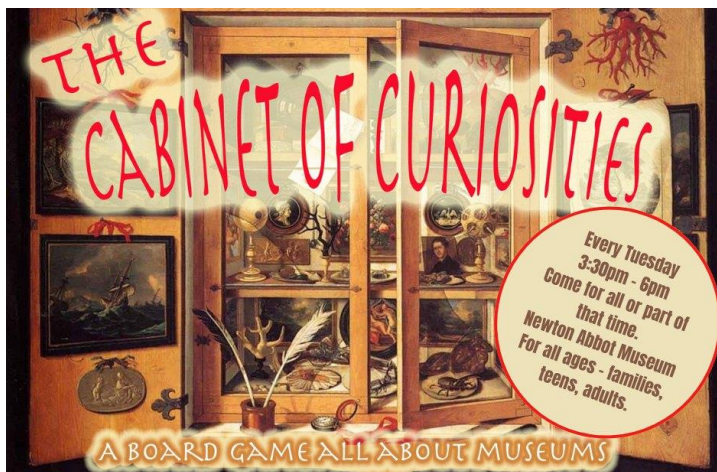
