Reading: A comprehension about 'The Highwayman.'

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have started working on one of my favourite poems in English this week – 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. It is a narrative poem, which means it tells a story. Poetry can often be overlooked because of a misconception that the reader can't gain very much from poetry but 'The Highwayman' is packed full of a wide variety of strong emotions: love, fear, courage, risk – you name it, it's probably in there! There was an audible gasp from the children when the final twist in the poem was revealed: I am delighted with how well they have engaged with the poem. They worked in pairs or groups to draw the meaning of a stanza so that, when we put it together, we had unpicked the shape and story of the whole poem.


