This term in History we will be looking at Toys that our parents and grandparents played with and this week we have attempted our own family trees!

Star of the Week – Brody – For making a strong start to Year 2! In Art this half term we are looking at the artist Valerie Davide and her charcoal drawings of animals. We had a go at using charcoal to discover tone – how we make lighter and darker tones by pressing harder, smudging and blending.

In Religion and Worldviews we are learning about the Creation story from the Bible. This week we discussed what Christians believe that God is like. Children suggested 'good', 'powerful', 'friendly' and 'creative' – to name a few.

In Maths the Year 1 and Year 2 children have been learning about place value – Year 1 children working with the numbers to 10 and Year 2 children working on numbers to 100. Please find linked work in their home learning books. EYFS children have been looking at the 'one-ness of one' in their NumberSense lesssons this week.

We have started up RWInc this week with new groups and reading teachers. Please be aware that we are no longer setting reading homework online on Oxford Owl, but the expectation remains that children read their book bag books 4 or 5 times a week and Reading Records are signed. Please can we make sure that book bags are brought in every day, but particularly on Thursdays so that reading books can be changed and Home Learning books given out for the weekend.
