Dear Parents and Carers.

This week in English, the children have produced their end of unit outcome – a formal persuasive letter to Mr O'Sullivan, aiming to persuade him to allow the children in All Saints Marsh to participate in a local music event. The way our English teaching works is that we progress through a very structured unit and then the children have to use the skills they have been taught in the unit (and other skills they think will be useful) independently in a similar type of writing piece. Because the outcome is similar, but not the same, the children have the choice to show their skills in different parts of the piece than the modelled unit version. This is really exciting! With support, Templar are starting to embrace the challenge of using their skills in planning and then using them independently in their own outcomes and we are really proud of them

from home, and for always being ready to share in class.

We would just like to explain why, sometimes, there is a delay in children coming out from the cloakroom in Templar class, ready to be dismissed at home-time. We do not all fit into our cloakroom at once so it is necessary to stagger the class. This is always done at random: because children do not sit in the same places in class each day, they are never released down to the cloakroom in the same order. Some children also have more belongings than others. We always leave the classroom on time but thank you very much for your patience in actually then getting out to parents!

Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

The Department for Education (DfE) funded holiday activities and food (HAF) programme aims to support children to eat more healthily, be more active over the school holidays and have a greater knowledge of health and nutrition as well as be more engaged with school and other local services.

The programme is for children who are eligible for benefit-related free school meals.

The HAF programme covers four days at Easter, 16 days in the summer and days at Christmas – it does not run in half-term holidays.

The HAF winter 2024 programme is now live and available to book!

Household Support Fund

The Government has made funding available to local councils so that they can offer direct support to those most in need in their area. It's called the <u>Household Support Fund.</u>

It must be used to help people who are struggling to pay for food, energy, water bills and other related essentials, and specifically those households that may not be eligible for other support that is already available from the Government.

This year, Devon has been allocated a little over £5 million, and we are working closely with Devon's eight District, City and Borough councils as well as voluntary and community partners on several schemes that will support our most vulnerable residents over the coming months. Citizens Advice Devon energy vouchers

If you're struggling to pay your energy bill or have a prepay meter and can't afford to top it up, <u>Citizens</u> Advice Devon can help.

We've given Citizens Advice Devon money from the Government's Household Support Fund to provide fuel vouchers for electricity and gas to anyone struggling to meet their household bills, whether it's by prepayment meter, on receipt of a bill or by direct debit.

Citizens Advice Devon also provide longer-term support through initiatives that help homes become more energy efficient, as well as 'warmth bundles' to help people stay warm at home. These bundles include things like heated throws, body warmers or rechargeable hot water bottles.
