Dear Parents and Carers,

The children of Courtenay Class have enjoyed another excellent and exciting week, and their learning has included such lessons as Science, in which we conducted an experiment which involved testing out mixtures of soil and water as well as making predictions about this; for the latter part of this week (and also when we return from the half term break) we have been observing if / how the soil separates into different layers in the water, and also if the soil absorbs the water to any substantial degree. We also further expanded our knowledge about igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary rocks during a lesson about rock cycles this week.

In History, we have summarised our learning during the past few weeks about how the Anglo-Saxons changed England during their era. For

example, the children have discussed and written about how the Anglo-Saxons replaced Roman settlements with houses, huts and activities more akin to their native north German and Danish lands; created many new place names around England which end in –ton, –ford and –ham; and also were responsible for spreading Christianity around the country to a considerable degree from around 600AD onwards.

In Maths, the children have now finished their unit about area, length and perimeter (which included rectilinear shapes and a variety of other polygons), and they will be moving onto mass and capacity concepts after half-term.



FAMILY SUPPORT

Household Support Fund

We have access to additional funding via the Household Support Fund to support families on low incomes with food and utility costs. The scheme runs until 31st March 2025.

Through this fund, Early Help is able to provide a grant per family to support with:

- Food
- Support with energy and water bills for household purposes

Such as, for example, insulation or energy efficient items which reduce bills, the purchase of essential equipment such as fridges, freezers, ovens, slow cookers or costs associated with obtaining, installing or repairing/servicing such items (e.g. a boiler). Likewise, to invest in simple energy efficiency measures which will pay back quickly, such as insulating a hot water tank, fitting draft excluders to a front door, or replacing energy inefficient lightbulbs or essential electrical items. The intention of this is to provide sustainable support which results in immediate and potentially long-lasting savings for the household.

- Wider essential needs not linked to energy, water or food

These may include, but are not limited to, support with other essential bills, which if unpaid would prevent the household from either earning income or would make them lose income. Items such as broadband or phone bills, clothing, period and hygiene products, transport-related costs such as repairing a car, buying a bicycle, or paying for fuel/transport fares. This list is not exhaustive.

This fund is <u>NOT</u> able to provide funds for the following (which is not an exhaustive list):

Items deemed non-essential, washing machines, driers (often heavy consumers of energy), furniture, flooring, and school uniforms (for the latter issue the school should be contacted initially).

We can only refer one application per household, so if you have already applied in this round (November 24 – March 25), we are unable to refer at present. Families, who have not previously received funding will be prioritised.
