Dear Parents and Carers,

The children of Courtenay Class have enjoyed another excellent and exciting week – and many of them are currently taking part in a final day's fun at Heatree activity centre on Dartmoor!

In terms of lessons, we have been making good progress with our new maths unit about mass and capacity, and the children have been answering many fluency, reasoning and problem-solving questions about different grams and kilograms as part of this.

In RE, we have started a new unit about Islam, which has so far considered how Muslims might show obedience and self-sacrifice to Allah. We have also discussed the Five Pillars of Islam and how adhering to these should enable believers to become 'good Muslims'.

In Music, we have been practising songs (such as 'Mr Blue Sky') in advance of Courtenay Class pupils taking part in a music event alongside other local schools next month.

In Science, we have learnt about different bones in the human body, compared these to the skeleton of a diplodocus dinosaur and also researched how there are 3 main types of functions for different bones: upright support, protection and movement.

As a reward for their good behaviour during recent weeks, the children have earned 22 'marbles' and so they can bring a soft toy into school on Tuesday 4th March (as long as their soft toy is not too massive!). The children are very excited about this!
