Welcome back to Spring 2. We hope you all enjoyed a happy Half Term.

This week in English, we have started a new unit. It is a story unit based on an experience with a spaceship and some sort of space creature. To start each unit, the children do an independent write to show the teacher how much they already know about writing in this particular way. This then helps the teacher plan the next lessons. Templar needed lessons on:

- Story structure: This does not need to follow the set pattern of Beginning, Middle, End. We did not find this fixed language very helpful, so we have started using language like 'Event,' 'Resolution,' 'Build-Up' or 'Fresh Start.' Next, we looked at a range of examples that followed very different structures. For example, one started with an Event, which lead to more Events, ending with a Fresh Start!
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decimal fractions.

 Description. Good writing should help you picture exactly what is being described. We have learned lots of ways to do this already but we need more work on it.

Music has been such fun this week as we have practiced our Newton Abbot Music Festival songs with much enthusiasm! One of the songs is a particular favourite of Mrs Mott's because it is a rugby anthem – and Mrs Mott is obsessed with rugby! It is a very special song about unity and the power of working together to realise the best of yourself; it is a real joy to share this song with the class. The children need to learn the lyrics ready for the performance so home learning this week is a copy of the lyrics to all 3 songs for the children to learn off by heart. We will obviously continue to work on the songs in school but practice, practice and more practice at home will make such a difference.
