Dear Parents,

The children have come back from their half term break refreshed and ready to start their new learning. We have been busy already, and it has been so nice to see the children focused and eager in their lessons.

In Maths Year 1 and Year 2 have started the new topic of Multiplication and Division. This week we have been recognising and making equal groups, as well as practising counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Any support you can give at home in counting in 2s and 5s would be greatly appreciated (the children are experts at counting in 10s already!). EYFS are working on partitioning numbers within 10.

Star of the Week:

In English the Year 2 children have been learning to use subordinate clauses 'if', 'when' and 'because'. They have learnt to identify these in a

sentence and write sentences using those words. Year 1 are focusing on 'state of being' verbs and using these correctly in sentences.

In Science this term we are looking at materials, and on Tuesday the children had a go at making waterproof shelters to protect Incy Wincy Spider from the rain. They had to plan and design their shelters and then work in a team to make them with their chosen materials. The children were able to say which materials had the properties needed to make their shelters waterproof.

We have started Geography this half term and will be looking in depth at Newton Abbot and its surrounding areas. We kicked off our learning this week by finding out what 'physical features' are and identifying them in photographs of different places.

As the weather is (slowly!) getting warmer please can you make sure that jumpers and cardigans are all named clearly – it makes it so much easier to get them back to you if they are misplaced!

Next Thursday is World Book Day – please feel free to let your child dress as their favourite book character. Newton Abbot library have got costumes to borrow and at this time of year charity shops are full of recycled costumes so do not feel that you need to buy new!
