Home Learning

Dear Parents and Carers,

The children of Courtenay Class have enjoyed another excellent and exciting week, which has included them starting a new maths unit about fractions. They have been answering questions about numerators and denominators, as well as unit fractions and non-unit fractions, and they are making excellent progress with these. As written previously, because the use of fractions relies substantially upon knowing division and multiplication facts, I would whole-heartedly recommend regular times tables practise at home at least 3 times per week (by whichever method is preferable, for example by using TTRS or by writing down a set of multiplications on paper etc). Put simply, the more confident children are with times tables, the more confident they will feel when tackling fractions during the coming weeks.

Star of the Week

Oscar S is Star of the Week for always making such an excellent effort in lessons with his learning. Well done! In Science, the children have had fun trying to work out pictures of animal skulls (with jaws and teeth) as part of a unit which includes studying different types and functions of teeth. For example, we have been learning how carnivores have canines for tearing into the flesh of their prey, whilst herbivores often have a great number of molars for grinding vegetation up in their mouths!

In Geography, we have been looking at comparing the human features and physical features of Exeter and Rome, and this week the children looked at a variety of natural (physical) areas of Rome, such as the hills, the River Tiber and forests.

Other subjects which the children have enjoyed this week include PE (when we have been improving our athletics skills), Music (when we have been practising our songs ahead of a musical event in 2 weeks' time) and RE (when we have been looking at how and why Muslims pray as part of their religion).

In terms of homework for the forthcoming week, I've created some spellings and handwriting. However for this week only, instead of Maths homework, I've asked children to spend their time learning our 4 songs ahead of the musical event in 2 weeks' time.
