FREE SCHOOL MEALS

With the recent change in Government in the UK, we have been informed that it is possible that there may be a change with new free school meal applications.

Currently if you apply for Free School Meals and you are successful your child is guaranteed to have free school meals until they leave Primary School at the end of Year 6. We have been informed that after **1***st* **April 2025** this may change and your children would be subject to ongoing checks and if your circumstances change you may no longer be eligible and free school meals would stop.

Therefore, can we please encourage any family who thinks they may be entitled to free school meals (even if your child is in Reception or Key Stage 1 and therefore does not currently pay for their meals), to please apply as soon as possible and before the end of March 2025. If you are successful this will guarantee your child remains eligible until the end of Primary School. You can make the application online at the Devon Citizen Portal <u>Free school meals - Support</u> for schools and settings Alternatively, please email the school at allsaints@lapsw.org and a paper form can be sent home which can be returned to the office who will then submit this for you. Please do remember though, this needs to be before the end of March 2025 to ensure you receive this on an ongoing basis.

If your child is already eligible then you do not need to take any action and your child will remain eligible until the end of Year 6.

DCC has introduced a new booking system for parents to access and book sessions on their Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme.

It's been designed with feedback from parents, to make it quicker, less complicated, and more convenient to use from mobile phones and tablets, as well as laptops and PCs.

The new system, partnered with EEQU, presents the full range of holiday activities available to parents, with links to each activity for further information including where and when the activity is, directions to it, and other important information about the activity. Parents can also register interest in attending it.

Once a parent has expressed an interest in their child attending the activity, the booking system will

carry out an instant assessment of their eligibility to attend. If eligible, they will receive a confirmation of their booking, and be sent reminders in the lead up to the session.

If a parent needs to cancel the session for whatever reason, they can do so easily using the new booking system, which will enable other children on the waiting list to attend.

The Holiday Activities and Food programme is a government-funded initiative targeted at providing free activities and a nutritional meal to children and young people who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals during term time. In Devon, that equates to around 20,000 eligible free school meal children.

DCC have been delivering the HAF programme since 2018, and now work with over a 100 holiday activity providers around Devon that provide a wide range of activities for children and young people with all abilities.

The government has recently awarded DCC with £1.9 million to fund the HAF programme in 2025/26.

The activities run in school holiday time, covering 4 days in Spring, 16 days in the Summer, and 4 days in the winter. The HAF programme does not run in half-term holidays.

A spokesperson for the council said:

"The HAF programme is going from strength to strength with more and more holiday providers working with us to deliver a wide range of activities, with a nutritional meal, for children and

young people who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals during term time.

"We're excited to have received funding again from the government for this academic year, and we're delighted to have introduced a new booking system to make the programme more accessible and activities easier to book, without the need for the previous codes.

"We'd like to thank parents for helping us design the new booking system."


